VEGETABLE MAZE CONSTRUCTION

We greatly appreciate the work of our volunteers.

Weed Warriors

Last Friday, Year 3/4 and Year 4/5 went to a site along the Mulwala Road to release the plume moths that they have been breeding in their classrooms over the past two months. The plume moth, and its caterpillars, are a biological control agent for the weed, horehound. The site was the same one used last year as part of our involvement in this program. It was great to be able to find some evidence of the effect that last year's released moths have had. We were able to find some caterpillars and cocoons already on the plants. The moths released this year will help to build up the population and hopefully they will begin to control the weed in this area.

The Weed Warriors project is an initiative of CRC for Australian Weed Control. Thank you to Daryll Morris and Brian Burke from Central Murray County Council for their assistance with the program and Berrigan Shire Council for sponsoring the program.

The students were awarded a certificate to recognise their achievement and our school was presented with a big book called *Misbehaving Plants* to thank us for our efforts.



Get Hooked

Last Wednesday, Year 3/4 joined other students from Corowa South Public School and Sacred Heart Primary School, Tocumwal at the Get Hooked Fishing Workshop at Lake Mulwala. Activities included learning how to cast, tying knots, fish identification, size and bag limits. We also learnt how to safely release a fish back into the water. Congratulations to

Isobella Stillard for winning the casting competition by hitting the target.

We then baited up the rods ready to try and catch a fish. Children from Corowa South caught a golden perch or vellow belly and some red fin, but the catch of the day went to Jessica McCabe who landed a beautiful 50 cm Murray Cod. All fish were released to fight another day. It was a pleasure to take the children away on this excursion. Their behaviour was wonderful and several volunteers commented on their beautiful manners.
