We are looking forward to the day when we no longer need to set up our temporary kitchen on the verandah anymore.

- * Thank you to Peter Wright from Amaroo Sand and Gravel for donating another truckload of garden soil for us to fill our vegetable maze beds.
- * Thank you to the Noble family for donating old carpet to cover the compost beds and worm farms.
- * Thank you to everyone who has dropped off some bottles, polystyrene or building rubble to help fill our concrete pipes.

CAN YOU HELP US?

We are in need of the following items and would be grateful for any help in attaining them:

- * Bicycle wheels we want to use these to make an interesting trellis to grow beans on.
- * **Timber fence palings** (approximately 10) to make signs in the new garden.
- * Steel mesh or left over concrete reinforcing mesh to use as trellises in the new garden.
- * Lace curtains to protect fruit in the orchard.
- * **Old hoses** these can be cracked and perished. We hope to thread pieces onto bamboo stakes and use them to support bird netting or shade cloth to protect our plants.
- * An old **dog kennel** or something we could convert into a small hen house.
- * Manure to help us improve our soil as we continue to build the new beds in the maze.
- * Polystyrene packing and PET plastic bottles (any size with the lids on) to use as fill in our concrete pipe herb pots. We could also use old building rubble for the same purpose if you are looking to have a bit of a clean up at home.

SNOWY RIVER CAMP

Last week, Year 3 and 4 students spent three days on camp at the Snowy River Camp, near Tallangatta. Favourite activities included the giant flying fox, rock climbing, orienteering and abseiling.

We visited Glenn Wilson's farm to learn about the small hydroelectric plant that he has set up to power his own home as well as visiting the much larger hydroelectric plant at Hume Weir.

We visited Lawrence Lookout with its 360° view of the surrounding countryside. From there we could see Mount Kosciusko. Night activities included a night walk with torches, a campfire sing-along with
