Recently our K/1, Year 2 and Year 3/4 students completed the St John's ambulance Little First Aiders online course. The younger students worked through identifying what is a minor and major emergency, and what to do if they find someone in need of medical care. They role played and discussed **Check for DANGER** (make sure the area is safe), **Check for a RESPONSE** (can the person hear me? are they conscious?) and **SEND for help** (call 000 and locate an adult to help). The older students worked on **DRSAB** (Danger, Response, Send, Airways and Breathing), and the first aid responses to stings and bites.

All students received an emergency card with their own important information. They were encouraged to take these home and pop them in a prominent place, such as the fridge, so that should an emergency occur they have the necessary information on hand.

#### Dear Parents and Carers

### **COOLER CLASSROOMS**

You may have noticed a lot of work going on around the school. This is the beginning of the installation of our new air conditioning, heating and fresh air ventilation systems that are being installed in all of the classrooms. These will replace the current unflued gas heaters and older style air conditioners. We are hoping there will be minimal disruption, but over the next week or so each class will move into the library while the workers are in the classroom installing the units.

### **SCHOOL TIMES**

We are unable to supervise children before 8.30am. We have recently noticed an increase in the number of children arriving well before this time. If there are unavoidable circumstances which mean your child/children need to be at school earlier than 8.30am on a given day, please contact the front office.

### **ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS**

To help ensure the safety of our students and to improve our attendance rates, we have implemented the text message system on Sentral. You will receive a text via Sentral asking you to explain your child's absence unless you have already notified the office or classroom teacher. The quickest and easiest way to send an absence notification is on the Sentral app. You can also send future absence notifications via the app. If your child is sick and you don't have access to the app, please message the school mobile number: 0472 580 322 as the first option, or phone the school office on 5873 4242. Please DO NOT message or call the school excursion phone number: 0472 618 287 because it is only used on excursions. If you suspect your child may be absent for more than one day, please advise the office when you text or call to avoid you receiving daily text absence notifications.

### MOSQUITOES

We haven't yet received our supply of mosquito repellent, but as soon as it arrives we will distribute some to each student. The school was sprayed for mosquitoes by The Green Pesty in Week 2 of this term, which has hopefully helped keep the numbers down, especially around the buildings. Don't forget to give your consent if you would like your child to have staff assistance with applying mosquito repellent. The consent note is on Sentral.

# Inclusive, Engaging and Respectful School Package (IER)

The NSW Department of Education has released new policies, procedures and framework to keep students engaged in learning at school.

It centres on three new policies and procedures and a framework that together set the guidelines for how we ensure all children and young people can learn through public education in a safe and engaging way. The IER Schools package includes the:

- Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability
- Student Behaviour Policy and Procedures
- Restrictive Practices Framework and Restrictive Practices Reduction and Elimination Policy and Procedures.

With these new policies, we want all students to:

- be included in all aspects of school life and supported to learn to their fullest capability
- be supported in engaging, respectful, and effective classrooms with positive and inclusive practices
- · feel welcomed, valued and safe in our schools and classroom

Two of the policies are new: the Inclusive Education Policy; and the Restrictive Practices Framework and policy. Both clarify existing legal obligations, effective, appropriate and prohibited practices, and the rights of students, parents and carers.

The Student Behaviour Policy replaces the Student Discipline in Government Schools and Suspension and Expulsion Policy. The key change is the approach all NSW public schools will take to address disruptive or inappropriate behaviour by a student. The duration of a suspension will be reduced along with the number of suspensions across a school year. Every school will be able to draw on the support of a range of staff including behaviour specialists to effectively address issues resulting in these behaviours in order to prevent future escalations. We will continue to work closely with you and all our families.

It does not mean, however, that students who are violent or seriously disrupt the learning and wellbeing of others will be kept at school. Any student who puts the safety of other students, teachers and staff or visitors at risk of harm – will be suspended until it is safe for them to return.

The Inclusive Education Policy for students with disability and the Student Behaviour Policy become operational in Term 4, 2022 and the Restrictive Practices Policy becomes operational in Term 1, 2023. The staff and I are reviewing our current approach to all of the areas covered by these policies, and wish to share any changes we believe need to made with you next term.

Our school already takes a strong, positive student-centred approach, but we want to work with you to ensure, together, every student has the right support at the right time to help them grow into confident, resilient adults.
