We are currently in the process of finalising arrangements to begin advertising our Kindergarten enrolment campaign for students beginning at Barooga Public School in 2024. We know this is the time of the year when parents/carers traditionally begin to take an interest in what their local school has to offer. I'm confident of offering an extensive transition program beginning next term which will provide valuable opportunities for prospective students to engage in school readiness activities, meet staff and develop familiarity with our school site. #### Tell Them From Me Survey (TTFM)

The focus of this NSW survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. Students from Years 4-6 will be completing the survey this week with Mr Collins.

#### **Encouraging Positive School Attendance**


#### Year 1/2 History
