



Kitchen Garden News

<u>Working Bee:</u> This weekend we had seven helpers for our working bee in the Kitchen Garden. A huge thank you to the Talbot and Peake families who put in a great effort weeding and tidying a large part of the garden. We are very lucky at BPS to have such a large garden, it takes many hands to keep it in order (especially after the long January break!). We would love to have more helpers at our next working bee.

In the Garden: This term classes have been busy weeding and pruning after the holidays. We are slowly making progress! We have been harvesting and enjoying yellow watermelon, yellow cherry tomatoes, zucchini and marrow. We are planting cauliflower, carrots and brussel sprouts in the garden. We are raising seeds — purple beans, beetroot and a lot of Discovery Garden seeds donated last year. For the rest of the term in the garden, besides the weeding and planting, we will be making some traps for snails and slugs, experimenting with some traps to see what works the best.

Interested in volunteering but can't help during Garden lessons? We always welcome anyone who is able to do some work in the garden at times of their convenience. Anyone is welcome to come do some weeding or pruning - just check in with Miss Peake about what you can help with.

Donations we would love for the garden: *Straw* (it would be great to stay on top of the weeds!) and *1kg/1litre containers* (e.g. ice-cream or yoghurt containers - these are to build the snail traps.)

For sale: We have excess marrow squash for sale for a gold coin donation (proceeds going straight back into the program). What is marrow squash? Marrow is a vegetable similar to zucchini, with a firm rind and neutral flavour. It can be used much like zucchini. In the kitchen, we are making marrow soup, have used it in veggie fritters and will make some preserves. Our marrows are quite large - one marrow is between 1.5-2kg. There is no limit to the amount you can purchase. Please see Miss Peake before or after school.

Coming soon: Our pumpkin patch is laden with plenty of pumpkins. In the coming weeks we will offer some of our excess pumpkins for sale, again any proceeds go towards the Kitchen Garden Program.

<u>In the Kitchen</u>: Maths in Action lessons with Year 5/6 have included lessons exploring volume and capacity, measuring using millilitres and litres. They have also been making drinks, chicken and sweetcorn soup and enjoying seasonal fruit. Activities in the kitchen will now be focused on measuring in grams and kilograms, this week exploring net and gross mass and making mini pizzas.

Kitchen has included introducing and revising knife skills and getting to know the kitchen. Some favourite dishes so far have been panzenella tarts, mini quiches, veggie fritters and fluffy pancakes.

Thank you to our volunteers for this term - Nadine (kitchen washing), Lyn (kitchen and garden, caring for chickens on the weekends) and Matt (kitchen lessons). Linda assists with all lessons and also volunteers a lot of her own time – thank you!
